- Looking to replace current toilet with electric macerating toilet
- Looking to find out why current lectrasan has a constant scent
- Looking to bring lectrasan to dealer to get checkup / service
- Looking to combine toilet lectrasan controls to make cycle easy to accomplish



This is the Aft Head of a 1984 Morgan 416.

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- Hoses go down beneath toilet to inlet and lectrasan which on other side of bulkhead shown in the right of picture.



Heads: Manufacturer - Raritan, Model PH High-Boy

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- The raritan is beneath the lower shelf of the cabinet in the picture



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- The raritan is directly above these seacocks.
- One being the outlet for lectrasan treated waste, and the other being sea water in.



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- Hose to Lectrasan
- From toilet

- Hose from lectrasan to seacock

- Control switch



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- Looking down on lectrasan
- Fuses have been removed and are stuck to masking tape and numbered.
- Paper shows numbers and key to reinstall fuzes
